The "Pups" are honored to have Bob Huber, former NTA president and current member of the Board of Governors serve as our "Timberwolf Historian" and assistant in helping plan and put together this tour.

DAY 2 - SUNDAY, OCTOBER 16: PARIS.

Everyone arrives independently at Paris Charles de Gaulle International Airport. It's easy and simple to get from your arrival terminal by the free airport shuttle bus to our hotel. (D)

DAY 3 – MONDAY, OCTOBER 17: PARIS. Paris is uniquely Paris. We have a morning city

sightseeing tour and then leisure time to enjoy Paris to the full. (B, D)

DAY 4 - TUESDAY, OCTOBER 18: PARIS / BAYEUX. The main Red Ball Express Highway ran between Normandy and Soissons NE of Paris, where the non-stop trucks offloaded their supplies and then rushed back to Normandy to bring more. This was the Allies' supplies lifeline from August to November 1944 after the Normandy breakout. For four weeks Timberwolves drove for the famous Red Ball Express. Today is a fascinating day in which we retrace their Red Ball Express route from the highroad to Soissons, via the magnificent royal palace city of Versailles which also became General Eisenhower's SHAEF headquarters, to deepest Normandy. We stay in the uniquely beautiful, medieval cathedral city of Bayeux, home of the famous Bayeux Tapestry that you will have a chance to see. (B)

DAY 5 - WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 19: BAYEUX / CHER-BOURG / BARNEVILLE / BAYEUX. Among today's sites are the Mulberry 'B' artificial harbor ruins and huge German coastal gun batteries. We visit the American landing beaches, Omaha and Utah (where 415th Regt and 387th FAB landed on Sept. 7, 1944), the peaceful Normandy American Cemetery and Pointe du Hoc, still a scene of utter destruction. Then driving through typical 'hedgerow country', we visit Cherbourg where the rest of the division landed and see the Timberwolves bivouac towns, Valognes and pretty coastal Barneville, 104th Divisional HQ and the starting point of the Timberwolves' Red Ball Express trucking. (B)

DAY 6 - THURSDAY, OCTOBER 20: BAYEUX / BRUSSELS. When we cross the River Orne at Caen, we shall have driven the entire width of the Normandy beachhead from the American sector in the west to the British and Canadian sectors in the east. We cross





the entire width of the Normandy beachhead from the American sector in the west to the British and Canadian sectors in the east. We cross the Seine estuary by the spectacular Normandy Bridge to Upper Normandy where the famous and huge Camp Lucky Strike was, the Timberwolves' last stop in Europe before embarking for the USA after the war was won. Then from Amiens we cross through the terrible World War 1 battlefields of the Somme as we track the Timberwolves' transfer to Belgium in mid October 1944 just prior to combat. We head northwards to Brussels, beautiful historic capital of Belgium and administrative capital of the European Union. (B)

DAY 7 – **FRIDAY, OCTOBER 21: BRUSSELS**. By special request from our Veterans, a day trip to Henri-Chapelle and Margraten Military Cemeteries to honor Timberwolves interred there. Lunch at the

M&M's farm and WWII Museum replacing a dinner with US Soldiers. Optional: a free day in Brussels (B, L)

DAY 8 – SATURDAY, OCTOBER 22: BRUSSELS / BREDA. From Brussels it is just a short journey to Achtmaal and Zundert (Holland) where the Timberwolves first went on the offensive. It's



always a pleasure to meet our ever loyal Dutch Friends of the Timberwolves with their outstanding military collections. Today will be a very special day because they are planning a special program for us. Some free time for shopping and sightseeing in the mid-afternoon in the beautiful historic city of Breda with its pedestrianized center. (B, L)

DAY 9 – SUNDAY, OCTO-BER 23: BREDA. In the morning we meet our Dutch

Friends of the Timberwolves again and convoy with them to Wuustwezel (Belgium). On this day 67 years ago was the Timberwolves' baptism of fire when they relieved the British 49th Div (Polar Bears) who were defending Wuustwezel against heavy German counterattacks. Today the Timberwolves will once again meet the Polar Bears in Wuustwezel. A commemorative plaque will be officially unveiled and we will jointly celebrate with the people of Wuustwezel, the British veterans and our Dutch friends. Then we return to our hotel in Breda. (B, L)

DAY 10 – MONDAY, OCTOBER 24: BREDA. An exciting and emotionally charged day as we return to Oudenbosch and Standdaarbuiten to commemorate with more of our wonderful Dutch friends the Timberwolves' greatest and toughest combat action in Holland, the Battle of the Dikes. We are specially welcomed in Standdaarbuiten by our great friend Toine Vermunt who came to the last Timberwolves annual reunion in Chicago and has taken



on the mantle of Charlotte Ubaghs. Toine is planning with me a marvelous day, so be prepared for surprises. In the evening a celebratory dinner with all our Dutch friends. (B, D)

DAY 11 – TUESDAY, OCTOBER 25: BREDA / AMSTERDAM. We revisit Charlotte's daughter Monique Ubaghs and her husband Ade's fascinating WWII museum and planetarium multimedia show in Rijsoord. Then if the weather is kind enough, an atmospheric boat trip along the waterways of the Rhine-Meuse delta into Rotterdam, the largest port in Europe. We take a panoramic drive through Rotterdam as we head for Amsterdam. (B)

DAY 12 – WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 26: AMSTERDAM. A unique harbor city of 17th and 18th century buildings and canals, frozen in time and one of the great cultural cities of Europe but with a very relaxed atmosphere. First we will tour it on a canal

cruise. Then leisure time to explore and enjoy it. A grand Farewell Dinner Dutch style. (B, D)

DAY 13 - THURSDAY, OCTOBER 27: AMSTERDAM - USA. It's finally time to say goodbye and fly home at the end of our historic and memorable tour. We have tracked the Timberwolves all the way from their first landing in Normandy in the fall of 1944 until the victorious climax of their fiercely fought campaign in Holland. Let's recall what VII Corps Commander Major General "Lightning Joe" Collins said "The Timberwolf Division has indeed made an enviable record in Holland and is daily adding distinction to its reputation in the current operation." to which the inimitable and revered Timberwolf divisional commander General Terry Allen added "I wish to express my sincere personal thanks to you all. We must maintain our high standards of discipline, training, physical fitness, and pride in our units. NOTHING IN HELL MUST STOP THE TIMBERWOLVES." And it didn't, as we shall see when we continue to track the Timberwolves next time from Holland, through the Siegfried Line to the Rhine, central Germany



and to final victory and the end of the war at the River Elbe. (B)

Hotels: Unless otherwise stated, all tour prices are based on two persons sharing a twin/double room. Applicable single supplements are indicated for those wishing single room accommodations. We do not recommend triple rooms as they tend to be very crowded; in most cases, triple rooms are a twin room to which a cot has been added. There is no reduction in tour cost for triple rooms.

Deposits and Final Payments: A deposit of \$400 per person is required to effect reservations. This deposit forms part of your final payment which is due when billed but not later than 90 days prior to departure. Acceptance on tour is subject to verification of payment in full to MilSpec Tours.

Baggage: No responsibility is incurred by MilSpec for loss or damage to baggage or any of the passengers belongings. It is recommended that all passengers purchase baggage insurance.

Passports and Visas: A valid passport is required for all tour participants. Visas are not required for this tour program.

Smoking: Please kindly note that for the safety and well-being of the group, smoking is not permitted on the motorcoach at any time.

Cancellations for unforeseen and valid reasons in advance of departure are entitled to a full refund less actual expenses incurred and a \$75.00 per person service charge, if written notice is received not later than 120 days prior to departure. If cancellation occurs less than 120 days prior to departure, deposits will be refunded less a \$150 per person cancellation charge; less than 60 days prior to departure date, deposits will be refunded, less a \$250 per person cancellation charge plus any penalties assessed to MilSpec Tours by hotels, transportation companies, airlines and other purveyors of services.
