TOUR DESCRIPTIONS

OREGON COAST TOUR

Wednesday, October 8: Visit magical Ecola State Park, one of Oregon's most breathtaking vistas, which inspired William Clark (of the Lewis & Clark Expedition) to write of it in poetic fashion when the Corps of Discovery first arrived in 1805. Gaze at the stunning views of the rugged coast dotted with dramatic sea stacks (basalt lava islands). Stroll through the quaint coastline town of nearby Cannon Beach, known for its long sandy beach, Haystack Rock, art galleries, delicious seafood and boutique shopping. Ride along scenic Highway 101, stopping at secluded beaches, gorgeous state parks, and various natural attractions along the way. Look for whales, sea lions, seals, rare seabirds, bald eagles, puffins, herds of Roosevelt Elk, and countless examples of temperate rainforest flora and fauna. After an incredible day of exploring and sightseeing, return to Portland through the Clatsop and Tillamook forests, possibly catching a glimpse of the majestic Cascadian volcanoes, before being dropped back at the hotel. Guests always return refreshed, invigorated, and thrilled by the unspoiled, underdeveloped, and wild nature of the uniquely scenic Oregon Coast.

PORTLAND CITY TOUR

Wednesday, October 8 or Saturday, October 11: Visit the world-renowned and oldest International Rose Test Garden in the US as you wander through the various fascinating attractions of the Rose City's iconic Washington Park. Discover the 200 wildly diverse acres of the Hoyt Arboretum, a "living museum" of trees representing more than 2,300 species (63 of which are rare or endangered). See a real submarine as you explore Portland's charming east side, learning about the many beautiful bridges that connect the dynamic "personalities" of Portland's diverse neighborhoods along the way. Pass by Pioneer Courthouse Square, the South Park Blocks, the Pearl District, and our beloved Waterfront Park as you hear about the plethora of world-class restaurants, bars, wine shops, and breweries that make Portland a true culinary paradise. **(NOTE: Please list your first and second choices for this tour. COLUMBIA RIVER GORGE & MOUNT HOOD TOUR

Thursday, October 9: Drive along breathtaking, historic Highway 30 via the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Byway, stopping to see and explore stunning waterfalls scattered like hidden jewels throughout the lush, temperate rainforests of the region. Enjoy a delicious lunch while visiting the quaint community of Hood River, a renowned destination for kite and windsurfing enthusiasts from around the world. Venture through the rolling hills of the "fruit loop" and sample delicious produce from local apple and/or pear orchards as you capture views of two majestic volcanoes. Visit the national historic landmark Timberline Lodge, on Mt. Hood, built in the 1930s by the Works Progress Administration, and learn about the world-famous Pacific Crest Hiking Trail, which stretches from Mexico to Canada! Unique "rustic Cascadian" architecture, inspiring and harrowing pioneer history, the origins of skiing and mountaineering culture in Oregon—all of these serve as riveting topics of discussion while exploring Oregon's highest glacier-covered peak!

CAMP ADAIR / EVERGREEN SPACE MUSEUM / CAMP WITHYCOMBE TOUR

Friday, October 10: This is the capstone of our reunion—a day to share our heritage together. We begin at Camp Adair Memorial Park, a monument featuring each of the four divisions who trained at Camp Adair before deployment, including the 104th. See and hear the latest progress on the Adair Living History historical interpretive site, which is being built within an authentic WWII Camp Adair barracks building. Lunch will be on your own in the charming and easily walkable downtown of McMinnville, located in the heart of the Willamette Valley's world-famous wine country. From here, visit the Evergreen Air and Space Museum (featuring the notorious *Spruce Goose* and the SR-71 *Blackbird*) before going on to Camp Withycombe, home to the Oregon Military Museum.
