## CHIEF WARRANT OFFICER 4 ROBERT N. CLAGGETT

United States Army Reserve (USAR) Commander, 312<sup>th</sup> Army Band



Chief Warrant Officer 4 Robert N. Claggett reassumed command of the 312<sup>th</sup> Army Band on 21 October 2007, at Lawrence, Kansas. He previously served as the Operations Officer for the 387<sup>th</sup> CONUS Replacement Center (CRC) Battalion, Fort Bliss, Texas.

Chief Claggett is a resident of Eudora, Kansas. He entered military service on 14 March 1975 at Fort Carson, Colorado. In August 1995 he attended Warrant Officer Basic Course at Fort Rucker, Alabama and was appointed a WO1 on 29 September 1995 with the 312<sup>th</sup> Army Band.

In August 1978, he transitioned from active duty to the army reserve where he joined the 312<sup>th</sup> Army Band. As a member of the 312<sup>th</sup>, he served as Section Leader, Group Leader and Field First Sergeant prior to becoming commander. He also served in several staff positions to include Training Non-Commissioned Officer and Retention Non-Commissioned Officer.

In October 2005, Chief Claggett was mobilized and assigned to the 387<sup>th</sup> CRC Battalion at Fort Bliss, Texas. There he served as the Battalion
